When the following weekly internet newsletter from Dr. Alan Zimmerman appeared in my "in box", I was struck by how easily, once again, the message applied to Women of Today. In this "Tuesday Tip", Dr. Zimmerman discusses 5 short, simple phrases that transform and strengthen relationships. In Women of Today, one of the three principals behind our mission is fellowship. A large part of our foundation is built upon fellowship or relationships between members and community. Let's look at these five phrases and Dr. Zimmerman's discussion of them, and then apply them to Women of Today.

When I was growing up, I was taught a little slogan that was supposed to stop some of the bullying on the playground. I was taught to say, "Sticks and stones may break my bones, but words will never hurt me." As an adult, I realize how ridiculous that slogan is. The truth is ... words are among the most powerful forces on earth. Words can and do hurt. A few mis-spoken words by a corporate executive could turn off an entire company. A few mis-spoken words by a husband or wife could destroy a marriage. And a few mis-spoken words by a politician could start a war.

Women of Today: A few mis-spoken words said at a meeting or in an email, without much thought to "big-picture" consequences, can destroy a chapter.

The GOOD news is ... words can also be the source of great good. Words can motivate employees, build up relationships, and even make us think, wonder, and laugh. The GREAT news is ... there are three little words you can use to start new relationships, deepen old ones, and even restore those that have cooled off over time. And it doesn't matter if you use these three little words on your coworkers, your customers, your spouse, kids, or friends; they will enrich every one of those relationships.

Women of Today: These simple phrases will make the fellowship in your chapter stronger.

1. I'll be there. *When you indicate by your words and your actions that "I'll be there" for you, you're giving one of the greatest gifts you can give someone else. You're giving him/her the gift of support, encouragement, and peace of mind. The same principle applies to your company or your organization. People are looking for leaders who say ... by their words ... "I'll be there" ... and then by their actions show ... they are indeed there for them.*

Women of Today: When we have new members join, are we telling them "I'll be there" for you, and sharing the training and tools to be successful in Women of Today, or are we taking their money and not giving them anything in return for it?

2. I miss you. *Perhaps more marriages could be saved and strengthened if couples simply and sincerely said to each other "I miss you." This powerful affirmation tells partners they are wanted, needed, desired and loved. Consider how ecstatic you would feel, if you received an unexpected phone call from your spouse in the middle of the workday, just to say "I miss you." Of course, at first glance, this may sound like a phrase that is strictly personal in nature, but don't be too hasty to judge. After all, it doesn't feel very good if you come back to work, after being gone for two weeks, and no one bothers to ask about your vacation or what you did. It doesn't feel very good if no one says they missed you. And it's even worse if one of your colleagues says, "Oh, you were gone?"*

Women of Today: When members miss two general meetings in a row, does your chapter say “we missed you”? Consider expressing this simple phrase on a postcard signed by everyone at the general meeting when members are absent. You will be amazed at the return on your 28 cent investment.

3. I respect you. *It's the number one thing employees want to get from a job ... once they get past the pay, security and benefits. They want to hear and need to feel that they are respected. It was one of the secrets of John Wooden's success as one of the greatest basketball coaches of all time. Coming from his humble beginnings as a farm boy in Hall, Indiana, he understood the power of respect. The enormous respect he expressed for his players motivated them to win more games than just about any other team in history. To make "respect" a reality, Wooden often told his players, "Consider the rights of others before your own feelings, and the feelings of others before your own rights."*

Women of Today: Members need to feel that their ideas and efforts are respected and recognized. Appreciation and a solid pat on the back with a thank you in the chapter newsletter goes a long way, and demonstrates respect. And on the “other side of respect,” please don’t think you are going to be earning anyone’s respect by sharing all of your “beefs” with the whole chapter in an email. This is one way that technology is hurting our chapters. Please, THINK before you press “send”. You’ll save your self-respect and the chapter a lot of turmoil. There are two sides to respect – showing it and earning it.

4. Please forgive me. *Face it. Everybody makes mistakes. Everybody makes a mess of things once in a while, and every one of us has a few faults and shortcomings. And yet, many people find it very difficult to admit their mistakes and take responsibility for the damage they've caused. They see it as a sign of weakness ... when in reality, it is a sign of strength. When you say "please forgive me," you're owning up to the fact you were in the wrong, and in the process of owning up, you're also saying "I'm wiser today than I was yesterday."*

Women of Today: Maybe the project didn’t turn out just like you thought it would. Move forward by accepting your part in it and learning from it.

5. I'm open to... *"I'm open to hearing your side." This is a great phrase for diffusing an argument and restoring frayed emotions. Instead of coming across as rigid and closed minded, which almost always makes the other person more rigid and closed minded as well, you come across as reasonable and flexible.*

Women of Today: Sometimes we need to agree to disagree, and put the chapter and its needs first, over being “right”. It also applies to the standard, over-used “we tried that and it didn’t work,” or “but that’s how we always do the project.” Be open to new ideas from members that have been around for two weeks, two years, or ten years.

File an intent to extend with the extensions director and receive an extension manual. This is a valuable tool to help you complete your extension and do the follow-up for the next couple of years.

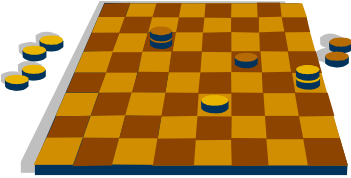


